Statement of Expectations for Friends of the Garden Members

Intention

1. I will participate in the Fulton Place Community Garden following the spirit of the garden vision, as stated above.

Administration

- 2. My contact information, as provided herein, shall only be used for the functions of the Fulton Place Community Garden and may be shared among the garden membership.
- 3. I shall attend the pre-season meeting of the Garden Committee in April.
- 4. I shall pay membership dues at the pre-season Garden Committee meeting. Membership fee for Friends of the Garden members for the 2017 gardening season is \$10.

Responsibilities for Communal Space

- 5. I shall contribute to the planting, maintenance, watering and weeding of communal plots.
- 6. I shall contribute 6 hours of volunteer time towards the garden. Work parties will be held every Wednesday evenings. If I am unable to attend, I will advise the Garden Committee and perform the equivalent of 6 hours of alternative duties as agreed upon by the Garden Committee.
- 7. Planting and installation of any garden structures in communal plots shall follow the direction of the Garden Committee.
- 8. Non-organic fertilizers, fungicides, pesticides and herbicides shall not be used in the garden.
- 9. Garden waste shall be disposed of in timely fashion according to the Fulton Place Community Garden "Compost Guidelines", detailed at the end of this agreement.
- 10. Waste that is not compostable shall be disposed of in the bins provided.
- 11. Watering practices shall follow the Fulton Place Community Garden "Watering Guidelines", detailed at this end of this agreement.
- 12. I may harvest produce from communal plots, with consideration of other members.
- 13. I am encouraged to report vandalism to the Garden Committee.

Compost Guidelines

- 1. I will only add vegetation to the compost (no meats, compostable plates, or oils).
- 2. I will not add any weeds, diseased plants, rocks, or any non-organic material (e.g., plastic) in the compost.
- 3. I will chop up any materials that are longer than 4"/10 cm for efficient composting.
- 4. I will bury all wet greens underneath the top layer of the compost.
- 5. I will add a scoop of browns each time I add greens.
- 6. I will give each compost box a quick turn/fluff each time I visit the garden.
- 7. If the compost seems dry when I turn/fluff it, I will add some water.
- 8. I will contact the compost coordinator if the compost has a bad smell.

Water Guidelines

- 1. I will use rainwater before using Church water as Church water must be paid for at an at-cost basis.
- 2. Only the Water Coordinator will fill the Church water tank.
- 3. I will notify the Water Coordinator if rainwater tanks are low or empty.
- 4. I will put the watering cans back in the shed when I am done watering.

Planting Guidelines

- 1. Aggressively self-seeding plants (*such as dill, coriander and poppies*) should be dead-headed prior to the seeds ripening.
- 2. Perennials (*such as strawberries, chives and mint*) must be planted only in the common areas and with the prior approval of the Garden Committee.
- 3. Very tall plants (*such as pole beans, corn and sunflowers*) should be planted only where other garden plots are not shaded, or in the common area and with the prior approval of the Garden Committee.
- 4. Noxious weeds, invasive or illegal plants are not allowed.

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
